Bailie Jim Kavanagh Update		
	Subject to change – currently 142 teaching posts to go this year and over 400 in the next three years citywide.	
	Glasgow has a high number of ASN children, not sure if there will be any loss of support staff yet.	
	Probationers will help teach classes however this is after a loss of teaching posts Glasgow wide and will likely never be offered a permanent post	
	Scottish Government may yet deliver money.	
	82% of council money is spent on education and social work. Cuts to all other departments before education was cut.	
	22% absenteeism level for cleansing workers and agency staff are having to be hired to cover this.	
Glasgow City Council Budget Cuts	Average 2.5 days per year absenteeism for teachers and 5.2 days for admin staff.	
	A lot of over 55 teachers looking for an enhanced package to retire/redundancy, this is not available.	
	No further cuts to Educational Psychologist but these cut a lot in previous years.	
	No discussion on cutting school hours for Glasgow as there is for Falkirk/Edinburgh. Only cost saving would be on gas/electricity in buildings for the half day.	
	Queried with Bailie Kavanagh as to why only certain coach suppliers are available to be used and Aspire for uniform being recommended as they are very expensive. Aspire is only guidance and agrees a more open market would be helpful for all school purchases.	

Effect on Cardonald Primary	Mrs Waddell advised classes are cut from 11 this year to 10 next year. There will be 4 composite classes, 2/1, 4/3, 6/5, 7/6. Some classes have no space for new children moving into the area. Teachers have moved to part time roles so no loss of teaching staff, however loss of teaching hours. Not every teacher will be teaching a class however Mrs King will be jointly teaching with a probationer instead of focusing on literacy. Teachers have 2.5 hours protected time per week. School cannot use supply teachers to help with protected time as no budget for this and difficult to get. PEF money from council is used to enhance core staffing. Book Week cannot go ahead the same way as previous years due to budget cuts.

Cardonald Library	Cardonald Library will be reopening. Cardonald Library is most used library in Glasgow. There are 3 proposals, none of these include demolition Building sealed and new roof added Temporary roof added and inspected every three years, this is already done with fire stations around Scotland with RAAC Library move to Cardonald College. None of the 4 ward councillors are keen on this as takes away from central location and bus route. Bailie Kavanagh will keep the Parent Council updated on this
