We are in the middle of a very successful book week which once again has been wonderfully organised by Mrs King, our CLOL for Literacy. Our Literacy Leaders and Mathletes have planned and led excellent Bookbug and Read Write Count sessions with our P1-3 children. We have had two visiting authors; Simon Puttock and Victoria Williamson and between them, they have delivered sessions to all of the pupils in the school. Upper School are further benefitting from Creative Writing Workshops during this week led by Victoria Williamson. On Wednesday, a storyteller will be leading staggered sessions with all classes in the hall and later this week all P1-4 children will be visiting Cardonald Library. Our Literacy Leaders are visiting Waterstones tomorrow and will collect World Book Day books to be issued to classes later in the week. Our Eco Committee worked hard to make a guide on how to create costumes from re-cycled materials which they shared with classes. On Friday, children may come to school in their pyjamas and bring a favourite teddy to read to. Our Literacy Leaders have planned art and drama activities which they will lead with classes on Friday. In addition, teachers are delivering lots of book themed activities with their classes throughout the week. Thank you once again to Mrs King for all of the incredible preparation and hard work that has gone into this tremendous celebration of World Book Week with so many exciting reading and literacy activities across the whole school.

The preparations for enriching the green spaces around the school are well under way and it is hoped that following this evening's meeting, the final order that I have prepared for plants, shrubs, wall climbers and fruit trees will be placed with McLaren's Nursery. Miss Mohd is attending this evening's meeting and any questions regarding the trip can be answered and included in the minutes.
