Blow Paint Monsters

What you need;

- Watercolour paint
- Water
- Straws
- Paper/card
- Googly eyes or make your own on other paper and cut out to stick.
- Scissors



How to make;

1. Mix the watercolours with enough water to make them runny without making them too light
2. Take your paper and a straw
3. Dip the straw into the colour you want to use and drop the paint onto the paper/card
4. Gently blow through the straw so that the paint moves but stays on the paper
5. Use this technique to make some kind of "monster" shape using as much of the paper as possible
6. Add a 2nd colour of paint but remember some colours will mix
7. Allow to dry and then add details such as googly eyes and mouths to make it a monster of your own.
8. Display on your walls or windows!

Day 1 -12th October indoor Activity



Indoor Bowling

1. Get together 10 plastic bottles or cartons (don't worry if they are not the same size or shape). Also get a sponge ball (this will be used to hit the bottles, remember you may be using it inside so don't use a hard ball)
2. If you want you can decorate them with paint, paper, glitter, glue and spare bits or craft bits and pieces to make them more colourful.
3. Place them all in a triangle shape with 1 bottle at the bottom, then two in the next row, then 3 the row after that and 4 in the top row.
4. Take 12 steps backs from the bottles and take it in turns to roll the ball towards the bottles, for every bottle you knock down you score 1 point – if you manage to knock down all 10 you score double points so an extra 10.
5. The winner is the person who has scored the most points after everyone has had 10 shots.
6. You can record the results on the table on the next page.

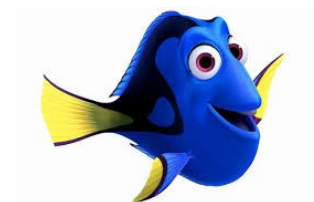

Day 2 -13th October Nemo and Dory Art



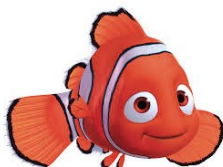
What you need

3-4 sheets of white paper or card; 1 yellow, 1 orange, 1 black and 1 blue pen/crayon/pencil or some paint; scissors; sellotape or glue.



How to make

1. If you are using a rectangular piece of paper, you need to make this into a square. Do this by folding up one corner and cutting the excess piece of paper off. Make two squares like this



2. Colour one sheet blue and one sheet orange. On the orange sheet, add a smile and white band at the top – you could leave this bit white when you colour in if you like.



4. Create some fins, a tail and eyes for both fish and a big smile for Dory.



5. Stick all the parts on and hurray you have a Nemo and a Dory.





Day 2 -13th October Superhero Handprints



What you need

Paper or card, various colour of paint, paintbrushes, coloured pens.

How to make

1. Paint your hand the colour of your favourite Superhero
It could be Spiderman, Superman, the Hulk, Batman or one of many others – use your imagination

2. Press your painted hand down on the paper then use the other paint and pens to decorate it, with the Superheroes features. Here are some ideas below that one of our team created!

Art Activity- Gloop

Gloop

What you'll need

- 1 large bowl
- 2 big spoons
- 2 cups of Cornflower
- 1 cup cold water
- 2 drops liquid food colouring
- Clothes you don't mind getting messy
- Newspaper to protect the floor

Method

- Pour the cornflower into the bowl
- Gradually add water until you have a gloopy mixture
- Let your child hold one of the spoons and help to 'stir'
- Add a couple of drops of food colouring if using



Day 3 -14th October indoor Activity

Marble Run - DIY



What you need;

- Cardboard rolls – any from your re-cycle stash.
- Decorative items – tissue, tape, coloured paper, gummed paper – whatever you like!
- Painter's Tape
- Marbles or small rolling objects
- Scissors
- Bowl or basket

Make a Marble Run – Tips and Hints

If you want to make a marble run work, it's best to test it as you go. Marbles move fast and like to fly right out of the tubes if they're not positioned to catch speedy marbles. We tested the sections of our DIY marble run a few times to work out the angles and distances. This is a fabulous math and physical science lesson!

Decorate your Marble Run Rolls (Optional)

- For this DIY marble run, start by wrapping the paper towel and toilet paper rolls with coloured masking tape. This step is purely decorative but totally worth it! Lots of fun layering and wrapping tape, selecting colours, and cutting the rolls.
- Once the rolls are covered, take a pair of scissors and cut the tubes in half, right down the centre.
- Find some clear upright surface space and set your marble run up on an empty wall, large window, or sliding glass door.
- Tape the highest tube to a spot that can be easily reach, then keep on taping rolls until you have something you are happy with.
- Change it up for more challenge – see tips and hints on first page for this activity.

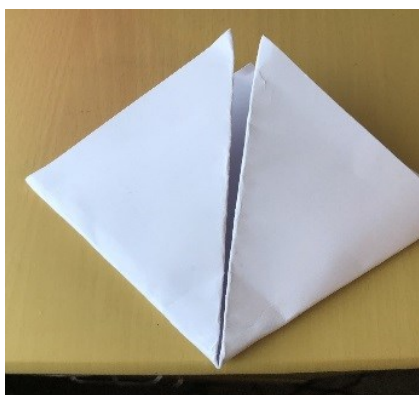
Day 4 -15th October Art Activity- HP Bookmark



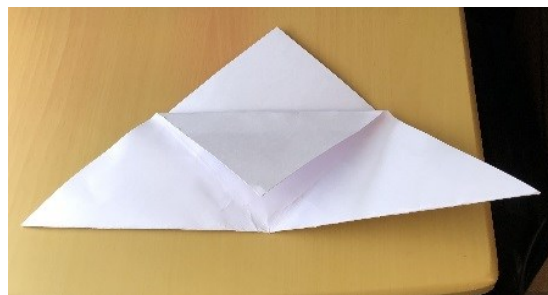
1. Take a sheet of square piece of paper or card and fold it in half to make a triangle.



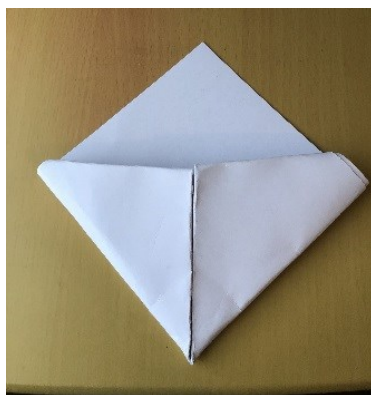
2. Fold each of the bottom corners of the triangle to the top point.



3. Unfold these to their original position then fold one of the top leaves of the corners down to meet the bottom of the triangle.



4. Tuck the folds that you created in step 2 into the fold you created in step 3 and voila you have your corner bookmark.



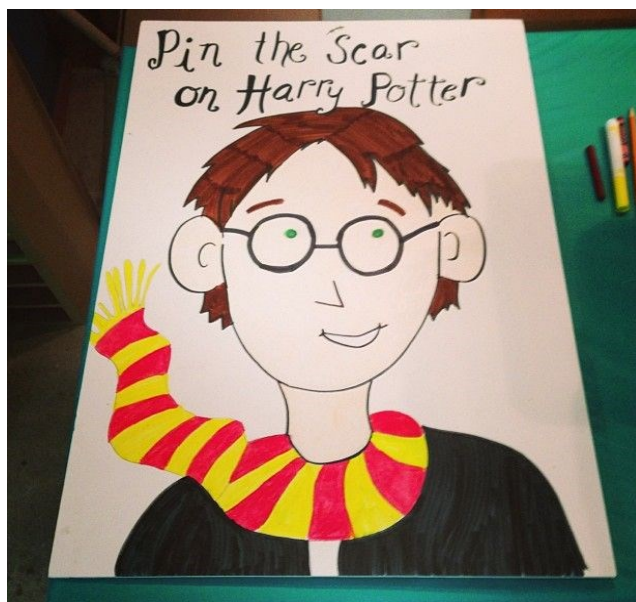
5. Now you can decorate them to look like characters or your house colours, here are some of my ideas, I am sure you can come up with many more.



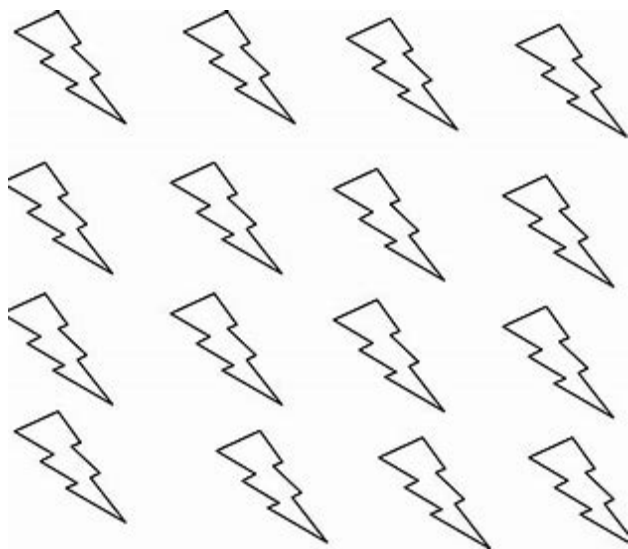


Day 4 -15th October

1. Draw a picture of Harry Potter (minus his scar on a large piece of paper or cardboard), you can do this or get an adult to help.
2. You will also need some 'scars' depending on how many people are playing the game.
3. Each person should take their turn by putting a blindfold on (a scarf will do also) getting someone to turn them around a couple of times and try and see if they can get the scar in the place it usually is, in the middle of Harry's forehead.

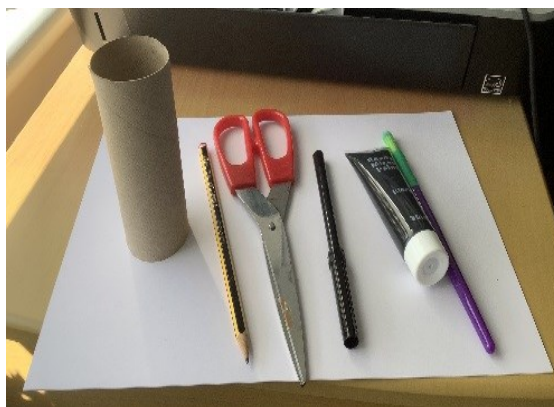
Art Activity- Bats and Pumpkins



BAT

What you need

Toilet roll tube, black paint, white paper/card, scissors, black pen, sellotape or glue. Purple glitter paint (optional)



3. Fold the top of the toilet roll into the inside and stick it down with glue or sellotape, push the ends up to make them look like ears.



How to make

Paint the toilet roll tube black, cut some bat wings out of the white paper and paint them black too. Add purple glitter paint. Cut some eyes and fangs out of the white paper also.



4. Stick on the mouth and the eyes and there you go you have a scary bat ready to put out at Halloween.



PUMPKIN

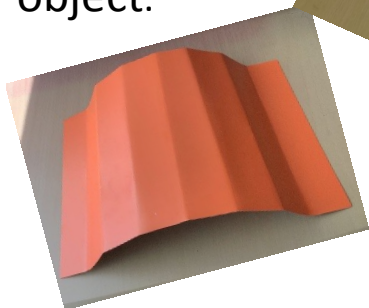
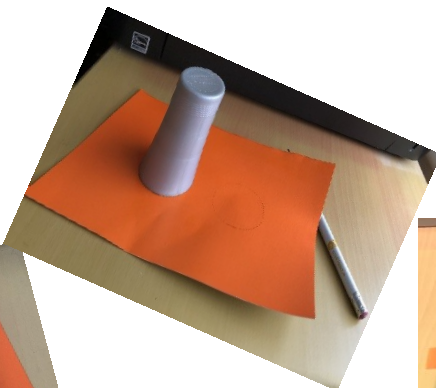
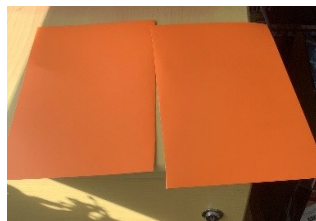
Equipment Needed

1 sheet of green and orange paper or card, scissors, black pen, sellotape, small circular object (lool roll tube would work)



How to make

Cut the orange piece of paper in half. With one half fold, it into 8 equal strips. With the other half, draw 2 circles with the small circular object.



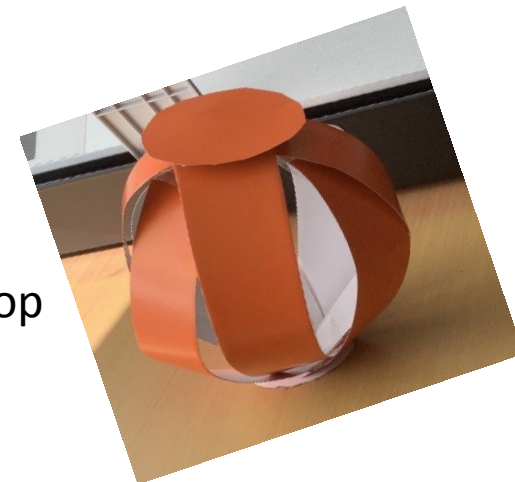
2. Cut out the strips and the circles.



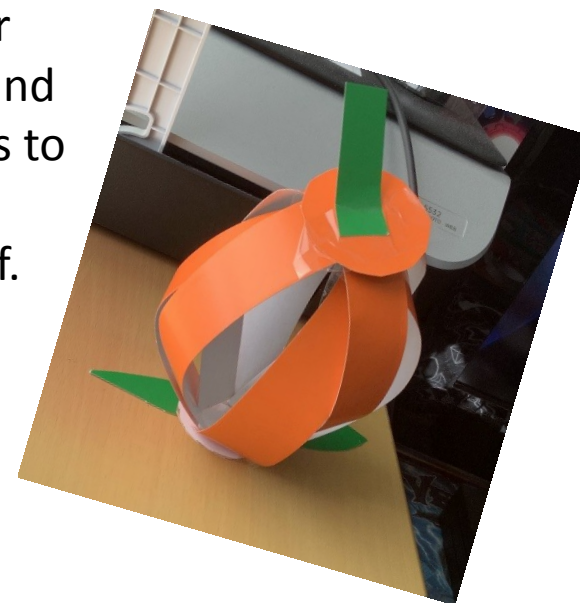
3. Using one of the circles stick each of the strips round about it.



4. Stick the other ends of the strips on top of the other circle.



5. With the green paper cut a stalk and some leaves to finish your pumpkin off.



Day 5 -16th October

Indoor Activity- Spooky Cookies

Ingredients

Biscuits

- 200g unsalted butter, softened
- 200g white caster sugar
- 1 medium egg, lightly beaten
- 400g plain flour
- Halloween shaped cutters.

Icing

- 125g icing sugar
- 15/20ml warm water
- Various food colourings of your choice.

How to make

1. In a large mixing use an electric whisk to cream the butter with the sugar until well mixed together and just creamy in texture. **Do not overwork** or the biscuits will spread when baking.
2. Beat in the egg until well combined. Add the flour and mix on a low speed until a dough forms. Gather the dough into a ball, wrap in cling film and chill for at least 1 hour.
3. Preheat the oven to 190°C, fan 170°C, gas mark 5 (you should get an adult to do this part). Put the dough on a lightly floured surface and knead briefly, then roll out to 3mm thick. Cut, by hand or with cookie cutters, to your desired spooky shape.



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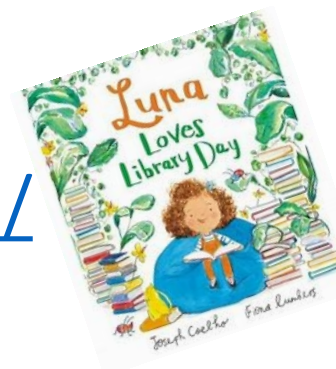
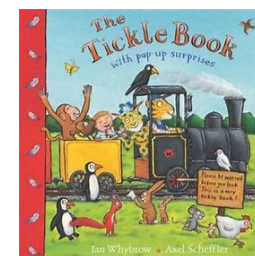
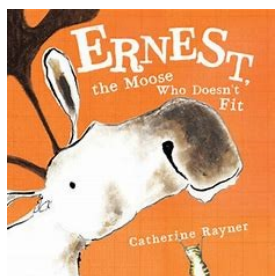
Day 5 -16th October
Indoor Activity- Spooky Cookies

4. Using a palette knife, transfer the biscuits to a baking tray lined with baking parchment.(Again make sure an adult helps as knives can be sharp)
5. Bake for 12-14 minutes, depending on the size of your biscuits, until golden brown at the edges. Remove from the oven and transfer to a wire rack to cool.
6. Whilst your cookies are cooling, making your icing sift the icing sugar into a bowl and gradual add the warm water (another part you will need to make sure that an adult helps you with), Until the icing becomes thick enough to coat the back of spoon, if necessary add more water or icing sugar.
7. Once your biscuits are nice and cool, decorate so they are Halloween themed, like the ones in all the pictures, after that all is left to do is eat and enjoy!!
