- Are there other poems they are well-known for?




### Poetry Activities

Write a poem with a similar theme, in the same style as the original poem.




Choose two lines of the poem and see if you can improve them.

Think about the inspiration behind the poem. What do you think might have inspired the poet?




Think of someone or something that inspires you in life. Who or what is that? What have they inspired you to do?


With some friends, create a drama of the poem.

Highlight the following in the poem in different colours:


- Adjectives

# Poetry Activities


Highlight the following figurative language in the poem using different colours:
